To begin, we would like to thank the generous individuals, corporations, foundations, and vital community partners who make our work possible. Our gratitude extends to our Board of Directors for their support, our dedicated volunteers, and our hardworking staff—this season and every season is only possible because of you.

At the Philadelphia Theatre Company, we believe theatre goes beyond mere entertainment; it serves as a platform for storytelling that connects us, invites reflection, and inspires. Cultural organizations like PTC are essential to Philadelphia's well-being, economy, and civic life. Our 2025/26 season focuses on themes of community, relationships, and the essence of what makes a place feel like home highlighted by *Primary Trust*, a Pulitzer Prize-winning play that opened our 51st season.

During our 2024/25 season, we celebrated our 50th anniversary, engaging over 7,300 patrons through our commitment to accessible, civic-minded theatre. Our opener, *La Egoísta*, featured an all-Latino cast and creative team, with

60% of single tickets sold to first-time PTC attendees.

Night Side Songs, a world premiere musical written by the Lazour Brothers and supported by The Pew Center for Arts & Heritage, drew upon real interviews and workshops with medical professionals, patients, and caregivers. We toured several locations across Philadelphia performing for free to reach more audiences and underserved communities. Happily, Night Side Songs will be produced at Lincoln Center this winter. Small Ball concluded the season with a whimsical tale exploring identity and purpose, inspired by "Gulliver's Travels" meeting our goal to present works that resonate with diverse audiences and foster community engagement.

We enhanced our programming last season with a benefit reading of *Frankie* and *Johnny in the Clair de Lune* starring Oscar-winner Da'Vine Joy Randolph. PTC originally produced this play by Terrence McNally in 1989, marking the first production to feature an entirely Black cast. We continued our collaboration with

the Terrence McNally Foundation with a developmental workshop and staged reading of *Night Science*, the 2024/25 Terrence McNally Award–winning play by MK Tuomanen.

PTC's educational initiatives connected more students to live theatre through student matinees and workshops, impacting more than 15 schools this season. These initiatives invite students and teachers to engage with the power of storytelling through our plays and musicals. We strive to provide impactful relevant programming combining performing arts training with career readiness and professional development.

We also expanded audiences through public programming initiatives, including Affinity Nights, Black Theatre Nights, and pre- and post-show offerings like after play discussions.

We look to strengthen our position as a leader in Philadelphia of new

works. We are thrilled to produce the world premiere of James Ijames's Wilderness Generation in our 2025/26 season, with support from the William Penn Foundation to work with HBCUs in our region. We will continue our vital collaboration with PlayPenn, creating a space for playwrights to develop their work through workshops and public readings, such as its annual conference and The Foundry mentorship program.

While our 2024/25 season was productive, it was not without challenges. PTC is focused on reducing debt and overhead to ensure financial health for the future. And we are grateful to The Suzanne Roberts Cultural Development Fund for their ongoing support as we address these efforts.

Thank you to our stakeholders for valuing our holistic approach to working with diverse communities. Your support is invaluable.

After the successful developmental workshops of Roger Q. Mason's *The Duat* and Ty Defoe's *Trans World*, we continued our partnership with PlayPenn during the 2024/25 season.

**The Foundry at PTC** program will continue throughout 2026, and will include workshops and readings planned for the spring of 2027.

New Play Festival this summer focused on three emerging writers from Philadelphia: I'll Eat You Whole by Chaz T. Martin, Talking To Og by Zahra Patterson, The Company by Lex Thammavong.
